We will also be assisted by Katie Kleeberger, Grant County epidemiologist.</li> <li>• <b>Discussion:</b>                              We hosted Nokey Pando and Sahlly Trevino from Hope Source. We learned of the services Hope Source provides regarding wrap-around homeless prevention services. They have a strong veterans assistance program, HUD, transportation, supportive services (ie cell phones, gas cards), the Sleep Center (which also serves as a resource hub), bus tickets, rental assistance, recovery coaching, and a Narcan vending machine. Both Nokey and Sahlly shared with us about their personal stories. They discussed the importance of “planting seeds for trees we will never sit under.” They talked about their outreach efforts and the importance of connection. They also suggested peer-to-peer is the best way to reach young people as they tend to focus on differences rather than similarities.
